

STATEMENT REGARDING ODOUR FOR PROPOSED PET CREMATORIUM

DATED: 22/08/2019

To whom it may concern,

The proposed pet crematorium machine includes an integral odour and pollution prevention system, known as a secondary after chamber which ensures no odour is emitted from the stack of the pet crematorium machines.

Furthermore, 'Integrated Pollution Prevention and Control (IPPC)' guidance and 'Process Guidance Note 5/03(13) Statutory guidance for animal carcase incineration', identifies key areas of potential odour release with regards to associated activities of the facility such as transportation and storage of animal carcasses. It also provided a list of Best Available Techniques for controlling odour, such as refrigeration of animal carcasses, storage in leak proof containers among other recommendations. This guidance has been integrated into a Hazard Analysis and Critical Control Point (HACCP) plan for the site (available on request)

Ultimately whilst it is expected odours will be inevitable generated, protocols are in place to the extent no such no odours will leave the boundary of the site.
